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It's August, and the dog days of summer are here in full force. However, your Board continues to be busy working on several items.

Actions taken by the Board at its June meeting:

- 1. The Board approved the two ARC applications submitted.
- 2. Associa was directed to schedule a meeting between the Board and Bustamante Engineering regarding the Reserve Study. The meeting occurred on June 21.
- 3. Associa was directed to schedule a meeting with Comcast to review LOE's plan for TV and Internet service at the Clubhouse. The meeting occurred on June 18.
- 4. Associa was asked by the Board to investigate the number of homes using the direct- payment system to pay monthly association fees and then to report back to the Board.
- 5. The Board approved the Design Committee's recommendations to purchase five ADA-compliant signs from Fast Signs and one sign from Signarama. The Board also approved \$350 for additional items needed for the clubhouse.
- 6. The Board voted to table the discussion of Princeton Hydro's proposal to conduct a Bathymetric Survey of the depth of LOE's five ponds.
- 7. The Board approved Outdoor Solutions' (OS') proposals to prune trees to the right of 6 Lowell and to perform regular gardening services at the front entrance and around the clubhouse. The Board also approved OS' proposal to remove two Alberta spruces and install four golden cypress trees. This Board authorization was contingent upon Bill Harris negotiating a better rate than had been proposed by OS for all these items.
- 8. The Board requested that Bill Harris obtain schematic drawings from OS and to schedule a meeting with OS to discuss their proposal to install four downspouts on the right side of the clubhouse, closest to the tennis courts.
- 9. The Board approved holding an Open House at the clubhouse, in conjunction with the Design

and Social Committee. Notification was sent to the LOE community. The event occurred on June 27 from 1-3 p.m.

- 10. The Board requested Mike Brown to schedule a community inspection and to seek volunteers for this inspection from the ARC and Rules Committees, the Board, and Associa.
- 11. Associa was instructed to restart the cleaning service for the clubhouse with JANPRO, and to ask that Terrence be reassigned to LOE for this purpose.
- 12. The Board approved the pool opening as of 7/1/21, with the pool season running from 7/1–9/6/21. However, Associa and the Board were unable to finalize details with United Pools regarding staffing, meeting State and CDC guidelines, etc., to open on 7/1. Associa and the Board therefore switched to a new pool management company, Pentagon Pools of Cherry Hill, and the pool officially opened on 7/12. Pool rules were also approved by the Board. Pool hours will be M/W/F, 11–5 p.m.; other days, 12–5 p.m.

REMINDERS:

- 13. The Board reminds homeowners who receive violation letters (i.e., mold, faded shutters & front doors, excessive weeds in flower beds, chipped medallions, etc.) that the letter includes a date by which the violations are to be corrected. After that date, Associa will conduct a second inspection to ensure that all violations have been addressed. If a violation still exists, and the resident has not contacted Associa requesting additional time to correct the violation, the homeowner will be subject to a penalty, as outlined in the Owner's Manual.
- 14. While OS will be applying fungus control throughout the community, it is important to remind everyone that watering lawns in the evening contributes to fungus growth. Instead, set your sprinkler system to go on at 4 a.m. on ODD days only and to avoid over-watering side yards shared with your neighbors to help avoid this problem.

Enjoy the rest of the summer! And remember to stay hydrated, especially when engaging in outdoor activities.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As of May 2021, the LOE Association had \$118,853.38 in our operating accounts and \$401,331 in our reserve accounts. The change from the April operating-account balance of \$195,002 was due mainly to the third installment paid to Design Alternatives in the amount of \$62,253.

The graph below shows a positive variance for the month of April in the amount of \$6,723 and a year-to-date negative variance of (\$14,377).

The Monthly variance consisted of the following:

Pool Salaries saved due to the later opening of the pool – \$6,000. Contracted Services – \$1,930 Utilities saving from the clubhouse – \$1,184. Professional Services – \$1,515 Repairs and Maintenance – (\$4,645)

The Year-to-Date variance consisted of the following:

Contracted Services – Snow removal and clubhouse renovations – (\$36,105) Pool Salaries saved due to the later opening of the pool – \$12,000 Landscaping Services – \$14,971 Utilities – \$4,700 Repairs and Maintenance – (\$10,576)

Keep Legacy Oaks Clean (KLOC)

Your continuing efforts to keep litter out of our streets, yards and gutters is paying off. Our neighborhood looks stunning! Thank you!

Spotted Lantern Fly (SLF)



The effort to treat six common ground trees and trap SLF nymphs with sticky tape has been extremely successful, as shown in the accompanying picture. Not too many nymphs made it past the first inch of the sticky tape. We tried to count the number of captured nymphs, but unfortunately

our adding machine ran out of numbers! The sticky tape will be removed around the end of this month and common ground trees will be monitored for evidence of SLFs. Should SLFs be detected, spraying of the affected tree may be the next step in managing this pest. Please note that a combination of treatments may be required to manage this pest in your own yard.

Tree Replacement Task Force (TRTF)

Thank you to Outdoor Solutions for monitoring our newly planted trees! Unfortunately, the dogwood trees were not happy in their new spaces near the clubhouse. By the time you read this, we expect that the dead trees will have been removed. We will be getting new trees for those spots in the fall, as well as a tree along Lowell Drive by the pool fence.

FACILITIES Our Clubhouse Do's and Don'ts

Oops! Accidents happen from time to time; we understand. Please DO clean up the clubhouse area that you have used before leaving, so the next person can also enjoy their clubhouse visit.

The clubhouse now sports a beautiful vinyl floor in the lobby and hallways. To maintain this new floor, we ask you to help keep it in good shape by doing the following:

- a. DO clean up all liquid spills immediately. DON'T leave spills on the floor, as the vinyl floor could be damaged and require repairs.
- b. DO remove any dirt and grit from your shoes prior to entering the lobby. The rug in the vestibule is a walk-off rug and is intended to be used for removing dirt and grit.
- c. DO broom-sweep the vinyl floor. DON'T use a vacuum with a beater brush on the vinyl flooring.
- d. If you need to clean up something sticky or dirty on the vinyl floor, DO use a <u>slightly</u> damp towel to wipe it up.

To ensure that these emails are not treated as spam or junk, the broadcast email address must be placed in your contact list. If an email address is in your contact list, it will not be treated as spam.

To avoid LOE emails going to spam, the email address <u>info@legacyoaks.org</u> must appear in the email address portion of the contact list in every personal device employed to access your email. Be sure the exact address is used.

As before, we ask that residents <u>not</u> reply to broadcast emails. No one will be monitoring the response site. If you have a question about any email, please contact a board member directly. The email addresses of the board members are in the Legacy Oaks newsletter.

If you wish to have a broadcast email sent out, please compose the email and send the request to a board member. All broadcast emails must have a board member's permission before they are issued. The only exception is a notice of a resident's passing, in which case a notice containing all the necessary information should be sent to Theresa Vecchiarello.

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LEGACY OAKS COMMUNITY POOL OPENING AND RULES

(Subject to Change)

Our pool season will run through Labor Day, September 6. Hours of operation will be from 11 a.m.–5 p.m. Monday, Wednesday, and Friday; 12 p.m.–5 p.m. all other days. Note that hours may change based on pool usage.

Legacy Oaks will follow State of NJ Regulations (as well as NJ Dept. of Health "New Jersey Covid-19 Pools and Aquatic Recreation Facility Standards, May 28, 2021") and CDC guidelines.

Among the highlights from the Regulations and Guidelines are:

- Only residents are permitted to use the pool.
- No guests (including grandchildren) are permitted to use the pool.
- Residents must show pool badge and sign-in upon entry to the pool.
- Pool umbrellas will be available for residents to use; however, umbrellas will only be handled by the pool attendant.
- Foot coverings are encouraged to be worn at all times in the restrooms, showers, and on the pool deck for safety and good hygiene.
- Hand-sanitizer stations will be located in the pool area for residents' use.
- Unvaccinated residents are encouraged to socially distance themselves (i.e., to stay 6 feet apart) in the pool and while sitting on the pool deck.
- Unvaccinated residents are encouraged to wear masks except when in the pool.
- Residents are permitted to use the clubhouse restrooms adjacent to the pool at their own risk. Residents will be asked to wipe around the surface areas they used with the disinfectant wipes provided. Discard the disinfecting wipes in the trash, not the toilets.
- Residents are required to bring their own floats/noodles/etc.
- Food and drink are permitted only in the designated eating area, as stipulated in our general rules. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the pool area.
- Residents need to comply with the pool attendant's instructions or risk losing access to the pool.

KEEP YOUR GARDEN GLORIOUS!

Hi neighbors! This year I have jumped into the business of roses! Chris Norris from Outdoor Solutions designed my backyard flower-bed border with spirea, butterfly bushes, and yellow roses. The variety of rose that Chris chose is the knockout rose. They are gorgeous. But now I must learn how to take care of roses! I found that my first challenge is what to do with the dead blooms known as deadheads.

Keeping these plants healthy and blooming will take a bit of time for me, but I think the effort will be worth the work. Knockout roses should continue to produce blooms throughout their entire season. With correct care, they will produce blooms every five or six weeks from mid-spring to autumn, if continuously deadheaded.

All growing plants need food, watering, and care. Deadheading is a normal part of this cycle for all plants with flowers; however, roses bloom more than most plants, so this happens quite often. Deadheading knockout roses will keep the plants looking neat and well kept, enhancing the overall look of the plant itself and maintaining its place within the garden setting. This will also force the plant to bloom larger flowers and more frequently.

When preparing to clip your dead blossoms, make sure the shears are sharp, as dull shears will make this job more difficult. They may also damage the plant itself by leaving torn and ragged ends where the cut is made. You should wear heavy gloves to avoid being scratched by thorns. It is also recommended to wear a heavier long-sleeved shirt to avoid scratches to the arms. The method I use for deadheading roses is to cut the old blooms off down to the first five-leaf junction with the stem. Clip the blooms at a 45-degree angle.

Regardless of the types of roses you're growing, don't stress about deadheading! Unless you really start hacking away at your plants, it's difficult to deadhead them too much. Once your roses start blooming, just take a stroll through your garden every few days with your shears, and snip off any blooms that have faded away. It won't take much time, and it can make a big difference in how long your blooms last and how many flowers your rose bushes produce each year.

Also, don't forget to deadhead the blooms in the decorative flowerpots that sit on your front steps or back deck. Trailing verbena and geraniums in pots

both look gorgeous, but if dead blooms are left on the plants, they will stop blooming. For verbena, cut the old spent flowers continuously. For geraniums, clip each stem when all the buds have passed their glory days.

Enjoy all that summer has to offer our neighborhood! In my opinion, that joy starts in my own flower beds!

Sudoku requires no calculation or arithmetic skills. It is essentially a game of placing numbers in squares, using very simple rules of logic and deduction.

The objective of the game is to fill all the blank squares in a game with the correct numbers. There are three very simple constraints to follow. In a 9 by 9 square Sudoku game:

- Every row of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every column of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every 3 by 3 subsection of the 9 by 9 square must include all digits 1 through 9

Every Sudoku games begins with a number of squares already filled in, and the difficulty of each game is largely a function of how many squares are filled in. The more squares that are known, the easier it is to figure out which numbers go in the open squares. As you fill in squares correctly, options for the remaining squares are narrowed and it becomes easier to fill them in.
